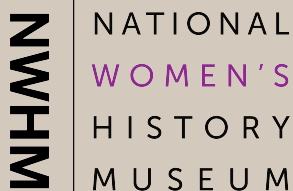

ELECTRONIC FIELD TRIPS

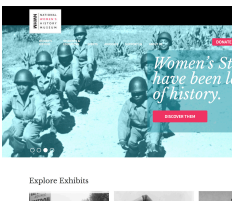

ENHANCED WEBSITE

Thanks to a generous grant from the PwC Charitable Foundation, the National Women's History Museum launched a new website with advanced content capabilities, interactive learning modules, revamped curriculum lessons and online exhibits, and optimized mobile content for its more than 1 million annual visitors.



CONGRESSIONAL LEGISLATION

In March 2017, US Representatives Carolyn Maloney (D-NY) and Ed Royce (R-CA) introduced HR 19 that would establish a national women's history museum and designates two possible sites on the National Mall. In June 2017, U.S. Senators Susan Collins (R-ME) and Dianne Feinstein (D-CA) introduced companion legislation in the Senate.



WHERE ARE THE WOMEN? REPORT

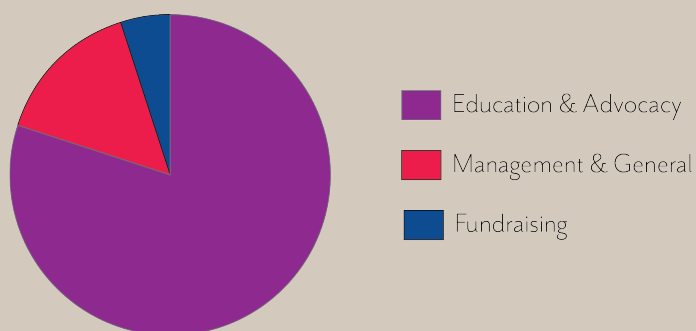
Where are the Women? examines the status of women's history in state-level social studies standards. The report finds that women's experiences and stories are not well integrated into state history standards, implying that women's history is not important.
